

Crafting and Optimizing Application Materials

- Resume Writing: Provide ChatGPT with your work experience, skills, and education, and ask it to help draft or improve your resume tailored for a school librarian position. Since I already have a resume, I used it to help update it for me.
- Cover Letter Drafting: Ask ChatGPT to help you write a
 personalized cover letter that highlights your
 qualifications and passion for the role. I attach a copy of
 my resume and prompt it to help me write a cover letter
 using information from my resume.
- Email Templates: Use ChatGPT to draft professional emails for job applications, follow-ups, and thank-you notes after interviews. I highly recommend using it in this way. It has been especially helpful for thank-you notes.

Will artificial intelligence transform school?

The boldest visions for AI in classrooms misunderstand much about education

"Books will soon be obsolete in schools," opined Thomas Edison in 1913. He believed the motion picture would replace texts and teachers as means of instruction, and that it would happen within a decade.

A century later, Mr. Edison is unwilling to admit error, no matter how hard your correspondent probes. He insists his prediction was "not entirely incorrect", and that he got it "both right and wrong". The best he will offer is that it was "perhaps a bit premature".

This slippery interviewee is not, needless to say, the long-dead Wizard of Menlo Park. It is a chatbot generated by Khanmigo—a set of ai tools designed for students and teachers that was released in America last year. Users who tire of teasing Mr Edison can speak instead to other giants of history like Albert Einstein, Winston Churchill or William Shakespeare, or with famous characters from literature. Kids may ask Captain Ahab about his whale, Victor Frankenstein about his monster, and Winnie where he got the name Pooh.

¿Por qué consume tanta energía la inteligencia artificial?

Las emisiones de carbono de Google aumentaron un 48 % en cinco años debido al auge de la inteligencia artificial (IA), informó el martes el gigante estadounidense, evidenciando uno de los principales problemas del fulgurante desarrollo de esta tecnología: su voraz consumo de energía.

¿Por qué consume energía la IA?

Los modelos de lenguaje en los que se basan las IA generativas necesitan una capacidad de cálculo enorme para entrenarse utilizando miles de millones de datos, lo que requiere servidores potentes.

Luego, cada vez que un usuario envía una consulta a ChatGPT o a cualquier otra IA generativa hace funcionar servidores situados en un centro de datos.

Estos servidores consumen electricidad, se calientan y es necesario refrigerarlos con sistemas que a su vez requieren energía.

¿Cuánta energía consume la IA?

Antes de la fiebre de la IA, los centros de datos representaban en torno al 1 % del consumo mundial de electricidad, según la AIE. Si se suman la IA y el sector de las criptomonedas, los centros de datos consumieron casi 460 Twh de electricidad en 2022, es decir el 2 % de la producción mundial total, según la institución. Esta cifra podría duplicarse en 2026 hasta alcanzar los 1.000 Twh, lo que equivaldría al consumo eléctrico de Japón, advierte en un informe Alex de Vries, economista de la Universidad Libre de Ámsterdam, elaboró un modelo del consumo eléctrico necesario sólo para la inteligencia artificial basándose en proyecciones de ventas de la empresa Nvidia, cuyos procesadores son esenciales para entrenar modelos de IA.






